NSOPW.gov links public sex offender registry websites from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, principal U.S. territories and certain Indian tribes to one national search site securely and free of charge. With a single query, NSOPW.gov allows you to quickly and comprehensively search across the country.

Sex offender data from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, principal U.S. territories and certain federally recognized Indian tribes in one search.



Up-to-date information on registered sex offenders 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, free of charge.



Customized searches by name, address, city, county, state or ZIP code. Access NSOPW online or download the app to your mobile device.
