









## United States Marshals Service District of South Dakota





#### Elements of 18 USC 2250

#### The subject must be:

- required to register under SORNA and
- a sex offender as defined for the purposes of SORNA by reason of a conviction under federal law, including the Uniform Code of Military Justice; under the law of the District of Columbia; under Indian Tribal Law, or under the law of any territory or possession of the US, or
- Travel in interstate or foreign commerce (or enter, leave or reside in Indian Country) and
- Knowingly fail to register or update registration as required by SORNA.

#### **Penalties**

Chapter 109B-Sex
Offender and Crimes
Against Children
Registry

18 USC 2250 Failure to Register



 Shall be fined or imprisoned not more than 10 years, or both.

Mandatory supervision of 5 years following incarceration.

- (b)Affirmative Defense;
  - (1) Uncontrollable circumstances
  - (2) Subject did not contribute to the creation of such circumstances
  - (3) Individual complied as soon as circumstances ceased

#### (c) Crime of Violence

- Commits a crime of violence under Federal law, UCMJ, DC, Tribal law, territory or possession of the US,
- Shall be imprisoned for not less than 5 years and not more than 30 years.
- In addition and consecutive to the punishment provided in subsection (a)

### **U.S. Attorney's Office**

- Makes the decision to prosecute a Walsh Act violation; they have wide discretion and considerable autonomy.
- USAO typically will consider severity of subject's offense, risk to the community and quality/quantity of evidence against the subject.
- USAO may also consider the willingness and ability
  of a state to prosecute a related violation, as well as
  the relative severity of the available state penalty.

#### **USAO** District of SD

- USAO dictates the criteria for prosecution of offenders identified under the Act.
- Offenders convictions for crimes against child/minor will take priority for consideration of prosecution.
- USAO may prosecute cases in either jurisdiction, where the subject is located/arrested and has failed to register as required.
- Generally, cases should be prosecuted in the jurisdiction where the subject is arrested.
- The violation meets the criteria of the elements described in the Act.

## **USMS ROLE**

#### **USMS Sex Offender Investigations Branch**



The specific role of the USMS in enforcing the Act is set out at 42 USC 16941(a), which states, in part, that the "Attorney General shall use the resources of Federal law enforcement, including the **United States Marshals** Service, to assist jurisdictions in locating and apprehending sex offenders who violate sex offender registration requirements."



- The OST-Department of Public Safety has been registering Sex Offenders since 2000 by creating Tribal Ordinance 00-27 "Ordinance of the Oglala Sioux Tribal council Establishing Mandatory Registration of Convicted Sex Offenders on the Pine Ridge Reservation".
- Tribal Ordinance 05-14 amended Tribal Ordinance 00-27 "Ordinance of the Oglala Sioux Tribal Council Amending Ordinance No. 00-27, Establishing Mandatory Registration of Convicted Sex Offenders on the Pine Ridge Reservation to include Section F. Registration information for Offenders will be placed on the Oglala Sioux Tribe Department of Public Safety Website





- In 2007, I was contacted by Peggy Nickerson, SD DCI Sex Offender Coordinator.
- Peggy informed me of the upcoming changes and invited me to the State meeting.
- So after this meeting. Tribal Council enacted the changes required by SORNA in Tribal Ordinance 07-11. "Ordinance of the Oglala Sioux Tribal Council Amending Ordinance 00-27 and Ordinance 05-14 Establishing Mandatory Registration of convicted Sex Offenders on the Pine Ridge Reservation.



- In 2011 the Tribe enacted Ordinance No 11-12: "Ordinance of the Oglala Sioux Tribal Council electing to implement the Adam Walsh Act and the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) and to submit Memorandum to the United States Department of Justice".
- Also Ordinance No 11-13: "Ordinance of the Oglala Sioux Tribal Council adopting the Oglala Sioux Tribe Sex Offender Registration Code and Related Forms, Policies and Procedures





- There are currently 104 registered Sex Offenders and 5 Non Compliant Sex Offenders
- In January of 2011, OST-Department of Public Safety and the US Marshals, set up the 1<sup>st</sup> Sex Offender Coordinated Compliance and Enforcement Review (SOCCER) in the State of South Dakota
- Since this time there has been an SOCCER in July 2014 and March 2016.
- The State Sex Offender Compliance Officer Peggy Nickerson, has been a great asset to my department. She was able to help me get all sex offenders within the Pine Ridge Reservation, registered and compliant.
