## A BILL

To amend the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act to require the Secretary of Defense to inform the Attorney General of persons required to register as sex offenders.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Military Sex Offender  
5 Reporting Act of 2015”.

1 **SEC. 2. REGISTRATION OF SEX OFFENDERS RELEASED**  
2 **FROM MILITARY CORRECTIONS FACILITIES**  
3 **OR UPON CONVICTION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Sex Offender Registration  
5 and Notification Act is amended by inserting after section  
6 128 (42 U.S.C. 16928) the following:

7 **“SEC. 128A. REGISTRATION OF SEX OFFENDERS RELEASED**  
8 **FROM MILITARY CORRECTIONS FACILITIES**  
9 **OR UPON CONVICTION.**

10 “The Secretary of Defense shall provide to the Attor-  
11 ney General the information described in section 114 to  
12 be included in the National Sex Offender Registry regard-  
13 ing persons—

14 “(1)(A) released from military corrections facili-  
15 ties; or

16 “(B) convicted if the sentences adjudged by  
17 courts-martial under chapter 47 of title 10, United  
18 States Code (the Uniform Code of Military Justice),  
19 do not include confinement; and

20 “(2) required to register under this title.”.

21 (b) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—  
22 The table of contents of the Adam Walsh Child Protection  
23 and Safety Act is amended by inserting after the item re-  
24 lating to section 128 the following:

“Sec. 128A. Registration of sex offenders released from military corrections facilities or upon conviction.”.
